

Searching for Vector Files

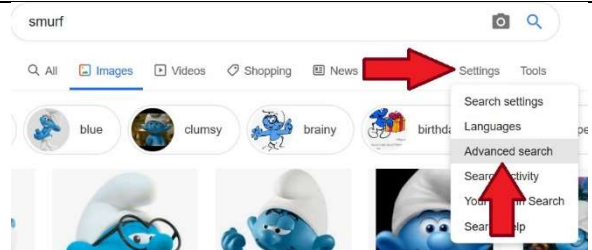
Step 1: Begin an image search

- Go to <https://images.google.com/>
- Enter your desired search term(s)
- Press the “Enter” key on your keyboard, or click the picture of the magnifying glass to begin the search



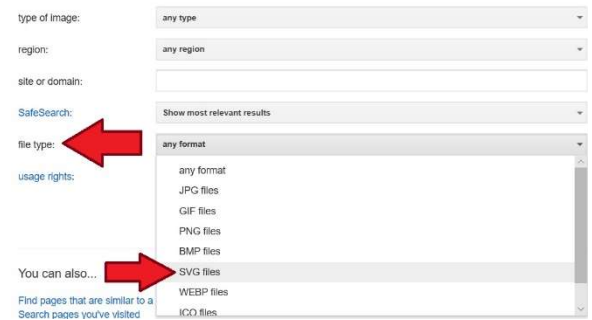
Step 2: Go to Advanced Search

- From the options under your search field, click on “Settings”
- From the drop-down menu, click on “Advanced Search”



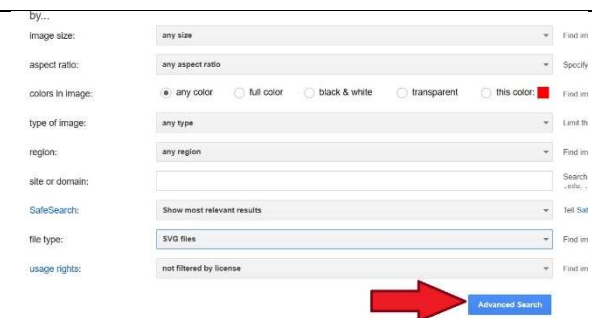
Step 3: Limit file type

- Scroll down to the bottom of the screen. One of the last options is “File type.”
- Click to bring up the drop-down menu, then select “SVG files” from the options



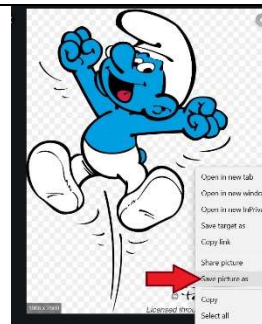
Step 4: Start the advanced search

- Click on the button towards the bottom of the screen that says “Advanced Search”



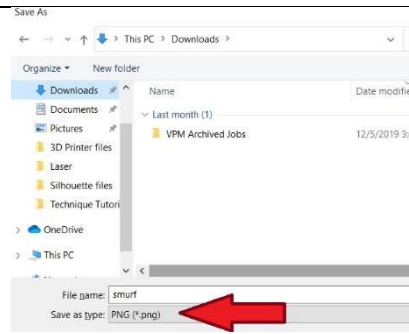
Step 5: Begin the saving process

- Click on the desired picture to select it
- Right-click on the larger version of the picture
- Select “Save picture as”



Step 6: Check the file format

- In the dialog box that opens, check to see the file type
- In this case it is a PNG file, not an SVG file. This is therefore not a vector file itself. In these cases the actual vector file may often be accessed by clicking on the image and finding a way to download the vector file from the website that opens



Step 7: If it is an SVG file, go ahead and save it

- If the file type is "Scalable Vector Graphics (*.svg)", click the "Save" button
