

## **Making Buttons**

<ul> <li>Step 1: Cut out the image</li> <li>Trim the paper containing the image so it is small enough to slide into the circle cutter on the left of the button maker.</li> <li>Center the image in the circle of the cutter.</li> <li>Press down on the red handle.</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Step 2: Remove the image</li> <li>Slide a hand under the circle cutter and use a finger to pop the image out of the circle cutter.</li> <li>Remove and discard any scrap paper from the cutter.</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Step 3: Gather the button parts</li> <li>Each button requires (depicted clockwise from upper left): <ul> <li>An image</li> <li>A button shell</li> <li>A button back</li> <li>A clear mylar cover circle</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Step 4: Prepare the button maker</li> <li>The button maker has two dies, labeled #1 and #2. Rotate the base so that die #1 is facing you</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Step 5: Insert the shell</li> <li>Insert the button shell so that the edges are facing down into the button maker</li> </ul>	

## Step 6: Insert the image and mylar

Step 7: Press that half of the button

- Place the image on top of the shell
- Place the mylar circle on top of the image

the (empty) die #2 is now facing you.

and then return it to its original position.







## **Step 9: Finish pressing the button**

**Step 8: Insert the button back** 

up.

• Rotate the button maker base in the direction indicated by the arrow (the opposite direction from before) so that die #2 is under the handle and the (now empty) die #1 is now facing you.

Rotate the button maker base in the direction indicated by the arrow on the die, so that die #1 is under the handle and

Place the button back into die #2 so that the metal edges are facing up. The squiggly side of the pin should also be facing

• Pull the red handle towards yourself and all the way down,

• Pull the red handle towards yourself and all the way down, and then return it to its original position.

## Step 10: Remove the finished button

• Rotate the button maker base one more time so that die #2 is visible again, and remove the finished button.
