## **Safe Child Policy**

Fond du Lac Public Library

Board approved: September 15, 2022 Previous policy dated: August 20, 2016

The Fond du Lac Public Library is dedicated to providing a welcoming and well-functioning environment for all ages. All patrons, regardless of age, are expected to adhere to the library's Appropriate Behavior Policy. For the safety and well-being of children up to the age of 16, the library has adopted the following:

- 1. Parents and caregivers are responsible for the safety and behavior of their children. Library staff cannot assume responsibility for any child.
- 2. Children under the age of 8 must be supervised by a responsible caregiver at all times while they are in the library.
  - Anyone, including siblings, under the age of 12 will not be considered a responsible caregiver.
- 3. Children ages 8 and older may be in the library unattended, provided that their behavior is not disruptive or inappropriate to other patrons or staff members.
- 4. In the event of an emergency or serious illness, emergency services will be contacted as well as the child's caregiver.
- 5. When the library is closing:
  - a. Every reasonable effort will be made by staff to assist the child in contacting an appropriate adult 15 minutes prior to closing.
  - b. Staff will not transport or escort the child to any location off premises under any circumstances.
  - c. If a child is not picked up 15 minutes after closing, library staff will contact the Fond du Lac Police Dept. to pick up the child.
- 6. Continued disregard for this **Safe Child Policy** may result in library privileges being suspended for the entire family.

## **Procedure for Inappropriate Behavior:**

- 1. At the first instance of inappropriate behavior, staff will have a conversation with the child and will reference the Appropriate Behavior policy.
  - At the second instance of inappropriate behavior, consequences will be introduced if behavior continues. Staff will attempt to redirect behavior with an alternate activity.
  - If behavior is not corrected, staff will ask unattended children to leave for the remainder of the day.
- 2. If behavior continues to be inappropriate or disruptive during the next visit, staff will again ask them to leave.
- 3. If behavior continues to be inappropriate or disruptive, staff will refer to our **Appropriate Behavior** and **Expectations Policy**, which includes banning patrons for egregious behavior, with increasing amounts of time.
